

Trinity ISE I – Conversation Task Pair Work – Learning a Foreign Language

STUDENT A

- 1. You are the EXAMINER. You are going to ask the candidate (Student B) some questions about the topic of learning a foreign language. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.
- 2. Before you start, read the questions and think about your own answers.
 - 1. Why did you choose to learn English?
 - 2. Do you think English is an easy language to learn?
 - 3. Is it better to learn a language alone or with a group of people?
 - 4. Do you think learning a language is fun? Why / Why not?
 - 5. Will you continue to study English in the future?
 - 6. What is more important, vocabulary or grammar?
 - 7. Have you needed English why you have travelled?
 - 8. Is it a good idea to learn more than one foreign language?
 - 9. Other than English, what language would you like to learn?
 - 10. What language do you think is very difficult to learn?
- 3. In the exam you have 2 minutes for the conversation task. Ask your partner some questions from above, but don't talk for more than 2 minutes!
- 4. After 2 minutes, change roles. Now, you are the CANDIDATE. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you.
- 5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.



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STUDENT B

- 1. You are the CANDIDATE. You have 2 minutes to answer the questions that the examiner (Student A) asks you. Remember, this part of the exam is interactive. The examiner and candidate are both responsible for maintaining a conversation.
- 2. After 2 minutes, change roles. Now, you are the EXAMINER. You are going to ask the candidate (Student B) some questions about the topic of learning a foreign language.

 - 2. Has your English improved recently?
 - 3. Is it a good idea to learn a language through music and films?
 - 4. What is your favourite word in English?
 - 5. What is more difficult, reading or listening?

 - 7. Why do more people learn foreign languages today compared to the past?
 - 8. What foreign language do you think you will never learn?
 - 9. Do you think it would be a good idea if everyone in the world spoke the same language?
 - 10. At what age should people start learning a language?
- 4. In the exam you have 2 minutes for the conversation task. Ask your partner some questions from above, but don't talk for more than 2 minutes!
- 5. Change roles again and repeat the task until you don't have any more questions.



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
